Cancellation and Refund Policy*

Please read carefully, as there are *no* exceptions. All requests for refunds must be made *in writing* to the Captain or the respective Activities Director of the Scottsdale Sea & Ski Club (hereinafter referred to as "SS&SC").

If your notice is received:

90 days or more before departure of the excursion: you will receive a refund, less \$25 per person.

Less than 90 days before departure: Cancelled spaces will be filled in the order of cancellation by the Captain as new sign-ups are received or sequentially from a "wait list", if one exists.

You will receive a refund, less \$25, plus any Event-Imposed Penalties per person. The Event-Imposed Penalties will depend on how soon cancellation is made, and SS&SC's ability to cancel spaces and recover funds from vendors.

For events with a price less than \$100, the cancellation fee is 10% with a \$5 minimum.

Unless the excursion is filled prior to departure, refunds for cancellation within 90 days will be issued *after* completion of the excursion.

"No Snow Policy": Determined on an event-by-event basis.

There is no refund for party cancellations within 72 hours of the party.

Note: "Event-Imposed Penalties" refers to penalties imposed by common carriers, hotels, airlines, ski areas, vendors or other entities with which SS&SC may have contractual obligations. If any unfilled spaces cannot be cancelled through any of these entities, the Event-Imposed Penalties may equal up to the cost of the excursion. Total cancellation penalties to club members shall never exceed the final published price of the excursion.
